HANDLE WITH CARE MASTER TRAINER CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

Future Handle with Care Master Trainers are identified and selected by the Handle with Care (HWC) program Partners or current Master Trainers as qualified for additional training. Qualifications include:

Training & Experiences

- Educational background in at least one of the following: child development; social work; nursing; adult education; teaching; psychology; and/or a minimum of three years of documented community experience
- Completion of the Handle with Care (HWC) facilitator training

Prior experiences as a Handle with Care Facilitator

- Having delivered a minimum of two 8-session OR four 4-session HWC programs to groups of parents/caregivers (not counting HWC sessions with individuals in home or clinical settings)

Completion of Information about Program Delivery

Collect, complete and submit to HWC National Office the following:

- HWC Program Delivery Information Form
- HWC Program Satisfaction Form
- Facilitator Self-Assessment Tool
- Facilitator Peer Assessment Feedback Tools
- Participant Sign-in/Attendance Form [names redacted]

Participate in the Training of Handle with Care Facilitators

- Co-facilitate a minimum of two HWC Facilitator Training Sessions with the Master Trainer/Mentor
- Complete and submit to the National Office the following HWC Facilitator Training Forms:
 - Trainees' Consent Forms and Background Questionnaires
 - HWC Facilitator Training Agenda
- Collect and submit to the National Office Training Evaluation Forms

Future Contributions

- Commit to ongoing communication with the National Team
- Become a Mentor (i.e. role model, collaborate with, observe, support) to new facilitators and potential master trainers
- Be available to deliver HWC facilitator training in local community or where needed (other communities, provinces or territories)



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
